

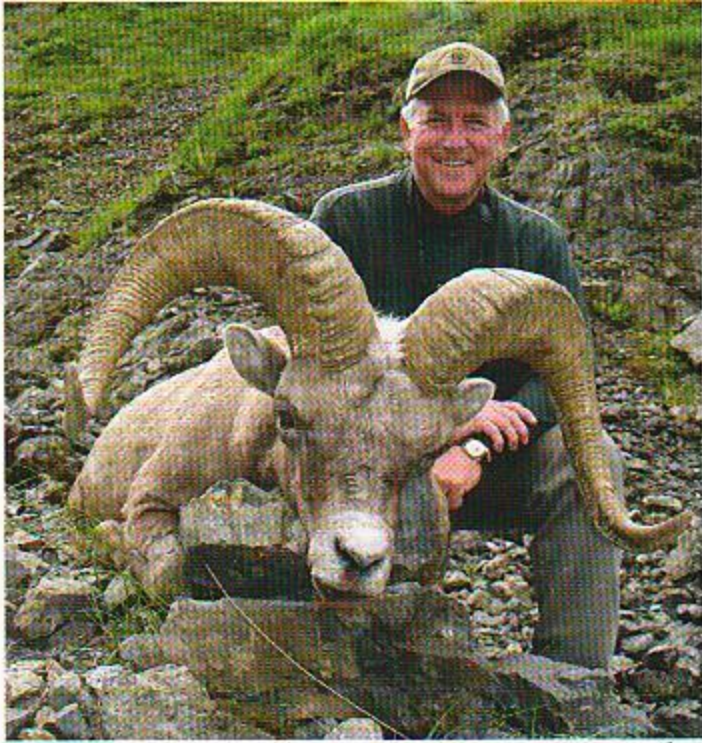
Wow, amazingly we have come to the end of the material for this time. Early on, we saw **Ed Yates'** (PA) report about the Koryak hunt that six of us took in early August 2006. I mentioned that I might not report on my hunt. I sort of wanted to wait on the other guys to get their reports in ahead of mine. However, since I was able to get two rams on that hunt (I applied far in advance for the extra permit), I will share one of those this time.

Many of you will remember that I had double arthroscopic knee surgery on December 20, 2005. This was my first true test in the mountains since then. My right knee is as good as ever, but the left one is far from 100%. I was able to do pretty well. I went up the mountain okay, but coming down

was a challenge. I did a little hop step, and that did help. Long story short, I made it just fine.

I got both rams on the first day. I spotted them myself (luckily) after the head guide had begun to walk away for points beyond. I called him back, and he got pretty excited. We did a perfect climb and stalk, and I shot one ram at only 50 yards. It was a very wide ram of 25 1/2" tip to tip. The body size was quite small, and looked very different from the other six snow sheep I had taken on previous hunts. He was a beauty, and I am proud of this trophy. I will continue the story with ram #2 in the next issue.
