



Eduardo Negrete (MX) achieved the Capra World Slam Super 30 with a Caucasian chamois from Karachayevo-Cherkesiya, Russia on September 19, 2015. While in Russia, Eduardo also hunted the mid-Caucasian tur in Kabardino-Balkariya and scored with that tur on September 22, which brought his Capra count to 31. For both species, Eduardo was hunting with **Profihunt**. For the chamois, Eduardo was

guided by Alexander and took it on the third day of the hunt with a 188-yard shot. For the tur, he was guided by Alexander and Moyet and said he took it out of a group of 15 on a very tough day with a 369-yard shot. That day, they actually started at 2:30 a.m. and finished at 7 p.m. Whew!

Before Eduardo started his hunt in the Caucasus, he hunted in Mongolia during August and was able to take a Gobi argali. Eduardo was guided by Odgiiv and was able to take the ram on the first day with a 250-yard shot. With the hunt in Mongolia and then in the Caucasus, Eduardo finished out mountain hunting for the species from each of the two regions. These include:

Mongolia: Altay, Hangay and Gobi argalis, plus the Gobi and Altay ibex.

Caucasus: Dagestan (Eastern), Kuban (Western) and mid-Caucasian tur, plus the Caucasian chamois.
